Troop 736 Code of Ethics

Recently, Troop 736 has experienced some inappropriate behavior on campouts. This has included: Scouts leaving the camp grounds to go fishing to avoid service work, cussing, bullying, physically hitting and kicking another scout, scouts not listening to adults and running to another spot to avoid the adults, older scouts not listening to the younger scouts who are in charge and other incidents that were not scout worthy.

EXAMPLES OF INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR

- Being disrespectful to an Adult Leader, Junior Leader, or Patrol Leader
- Refusing to help with camping chores
- Leaving a campsite or activity without the permission of the Patrol Leader
- Threatening or intimidating another person by word or action
- Physically hitting, kicking or personal attack on another scout
- Foul or degrading language
- Offensive comments or actions with respect to race, religion, ethnicity, or sexual orientation
- Behavior that disrespects other people, their personal property, or the environment
- Hazing or making jokes at others' expense
- Possession of electronic games or electronic devices without approval of the Scoutmaster (Violators will have their games confiscated and returned to their parents)
- Inappropriate games where scouts may lose clothing or personal belongings

If a scout cannot follow the rules of the troop and control himself in a scouting manner, he will be asked not to attend campouts without a parent present or may be asked to leave the troop permanently.

Parents – Signing this, you understand if your child is not complying with the rules on a campout that he may be asked to call home and have you come and pick him up. Only the scoutmaster in charge will make this decision.
